    - i. City of Boise Neighborhood Reinvestment Grants '18
      1. Boise Awarded \$808,200 in total awards to 15 Boise Neighborhood Associations.
        - a. CBNA was granted \$75,000 for Franklin Park infrastructure and bike racks and a \$2,000 (used to update website) mini-grant for communications and community events
    - ii. Proposed City of Boise Neighborhood Reinvestments Grants '19 for CBNA
      1. Bus Shelters- Gigi and Brian working on, cost <\$10,000 each.
      2. Bike Repair Stations- Randy working on, proposed locations are Cassia Park, Franklin Park, and Garden/Alpine intersection. Approx. \$2000 each
      3. Franklin Park- bathrooms, playground equipment, splash pad, wheelchair accessible toys, etc. Working
